The Grounds & Arboretum

At the foot of the front drive a fine view greets you.

The trees have always been a special feature of the estate and it is recorded that after the battle of Trafalgar many oaks from West Lodge Park were felled to provide timber for the ships of the Royal Navy.

There are now many specimen trees of great beauty in the arboretum, including three National collections of Hornbeams (Carpinus betulus cv), Swamp Cypress (Taxodium distichum) and Indian Bean tree (Catalpa bignonioides.

The Beale Arboretum consists of a large and interesting collection of trees. There are some 800 different varieties, planted by the Beale family since 1963.

You will find two hard paths leading down into the arboretum, starting at the right hand corner of the front car park. This is a path through the different areas of the Beale Arboretum, taking in Pines, Larches, Hornbeams, Birches and Maples among others. The paths also make a good route for jogging; alternatively for a longer run why not try the top field where the grass paths have been cut.

We have a selection of wellies by the front door if you wish to borrow a pair.

COUNTRY WALKS

West Lodge Park Arboretum - map and leaflet available from reception.

Walk around our 35 acres. Look out for the parliamentary walk on the left by the helipad and for the fine views over the Enfield Chace. Walking boots/shoes are recommended.

Trent Park: Drive down the front drive, turning left up Ferny Hill, and continue approximately two-thirds of a mile until reaching the entrance to Trent Park - parking on the right. Walk through woodland down to the lakes.

Hadley Green / Hadley Woods: Drive down the front drive, turn right, then right again and immediately left up Beech Hill. Continue until you reach a T-junction, and then turn right to Monken Hadley Church. Park here and walk around the old houses near the church along Hadley Green. Also nearby on Hadley Green is an obelisk to commemorate the battle of Barnet in 1471. Alternatively, turn left at the T-junction, drive through Hadley Common and continue down to the bottom of the hill, where you can park and walk in Hadley Wood.

Enfield Chase: Walk down the back drive behind the hotel, turning right into Cockfosters Road. Take the public footpath sign posted 50 yards up on the right, leading across the fields. Continue on this path until it is joined by another footpath coming down the hill from the right. Go up this path to the top (Hadley Road), turn right and walk along until you join the front drive of the hotel. Apart from the last section along Hadley Road, this walk takes you through unspoilt farmland, a long way from any traffic and lasts about an hour and a half. It can be muddy in wet weather.



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The History of West Lodge Park

West Lodge Park is an English Country mansion in its own 35 acre park about 12 miles directly north of Piccadilly Circus. Although so near to the centre of London, it is in the middle of several thousand acres of beautiful rolling country - part of the 'Green Belt' of London.

In 1399 the care of the Chase was placed under higher office of state known as the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster. The principal task at the time was the preservation of the trees and the game. For the administration of this work and the organisation of the large staff, three bailee lodges were therefore built - West Lodge, South Lodge and East Lodge.

When Henry IV (then Duke of Lancaster) married Mary de Bohun in 1421 he acquired, through her, the Manor and Chase of Enfield.

Enfield Chase was the scene of the overthrow of the Earl of Warwick by Edward IV at the battle of Barnet in 1471. The battlefield was Monkey Mead, now called Monken Hadley. The name Monkey Mead is retained by the brook which runs along the boundary of West Lodge Park in Cockfosters Road.

The heyday of West Lodge Park was most certainly in the 1670s under the ownership of Henry Coventry, Secretary of State to Charles II. He entertained royalty, the court, and the elite of the day at West Lodge, which was within about two hours by horse and carriage from Westminster, so an ideal country retreat.

From 1694 - 1716 West Lodge was owned by the disreputable Sir Basil Firebrace, who at one time was sentenced to imprisonment in the Tower of London for bribery and fraud.

The next owner was James Brydges, the first Duke of Chandos, who made his fortune in only a slightly less disreputable way than Sir Basil Firebrace, by being the paymaster - general to the army from 1706 - 1712.

On his death in 1744 the property was passed to his son Henry, the 2nd Duke. Like his father he did not live at West Lodge but at the main residence in Edgware.

After nearly 650 years, the Enfield Chase ceased to exist as a hunting forest and West Lodge became a gentleman's country seat, losing its responsibilities for the protection of the Chase.

John White Cater then took the lease of West Lodge Park in 1850 and lived there until his death in 1889. Alfred Mosely then took over the lease in 1890, until Ernest North Lewis became the first man to convert West Lodge into a hotel, taking the lease in 1921.

My Grandfather, Edward Beale bought West Lodge Park in March 1945 and moved there with his wife Betty and son Trevor. In 1958 Edward Beale aided by his brother John raised the standards by installing central heating and a start was made on building private bathrooms en suite.

Edward Beale lived at West Lodge Park for over fifty years; he formed the hotel's collection of Mary Beale paintings and took particular pleasure in creating the nationally recognised arboretum in the 35 acres surrounding the hotel. Edward Beale devoted much time to public affairs, and was awarded the C.B.E in 1966. He died in 1998 at the age of 94.

For 35 years the hotel had only two General Managers, Douglas Lunn from 1957 - 1969, then John Phillips from 1969 - 1992. Under the careful eye of my father, Trevor Beale, the hotel rose from three to a four star status and became well known when the England football team started to train in the grounds. Trevor started the series of classical concerts that are still running today, 40 years later. The hotel grew in size during this time with the addition of several extensions.

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In 1992, Andrew Beale became the eighth generation to join the family firm, and the third generation to work at West Lodge Park. Under my leadership as General Manager the hotel gained one, and then two rosettes for the cuisine, and further enlargement of the hotel followed.

West Lodge Park is noted for the longevity and continuity of the staff, some of whom have been here for over 40 years. In a world where hotels have become ever blander, we are proud of having refused to follow the mould and to be a little different while being very highly rated by the AA and by our guests.

It is my very great pleasure to welcome you to this lovely hotel.
